Welcome to the 2016-2017 School Year

Dear Shaker Road School Families,

We have enjoyed a beautiful summer here on campus, and we are now excited to begin the new 2016-2017 school year. We are heading into our 38<sup>th</sup> year here at Shaker Road School and we have some exciting new programs and faculty to introduce.

Caitlin Connelly will be working part-time in our Admissions and Placement Office, together with Sam Daniels. Caitlin has worked for the past 7 years as Associate Director of Admissions and Director of Northeast Recruitment at Hobart & William Smith College. Caitlin has extensive experience and knowledge with school placement.

On a bittersweet note, Nancy Heard has decided after 15 years teaching piano and organizing music lessons at SRS, she wanted to spend more time with her two new granddaughters. We will miss Nancy's professionalism and talent, but wish her the best as she enjoys time as a new grandparent.

For the first time we are adding an Infant and Toddler Program to the school, and have been working energetically over the summer to open the program on August 29. The entire threeyear-old room has been renovated this summer into a infant and toddler classroom. The classroom has state of the art facilities, including new furnaces and central air conditioning, lighting, equipment, and a full glass crib area for visibility at all times. Doug and the maintenance crew have created a natural playground, especially geared to this age group. Outdoor water tables, sand tables, vegetable plants, flowers, trikes, are all part of the outdoor space. The new faculty is skilled and experienced in working with this age group, and Gail Gettens has been a consultant throughout the process. The news from the middle school is Latin is being added to the curriculum for eighth grade. There have been more electives and enrichments added to enhance the program and empower the students with even more choices. This year the seventh graders will have a class block focused on preparing for standardized testing, public speaking and financial literacy. Eighth graders will work on a yearlong research project, which they will present at the end of the school year.

### SRS PARKING PROCEDURES

In our ongoing effort to improve campus security, please make sure that you have a **SRS PARKING DECAL** for your vehicle. These decals are to identify SRS families on the campus, golf course or river



fields by the maintenance and security personnel. They are placed on the lower right inside corner (passenger side) of your windshield. If you need additional decals, please see Betsy in the Main Office.

### **Daily Parking**

A friendly reminder as we start the new school year, the middle school upper circle is for drop off only. Parking is only allowed in the adjacent parking spaces to the right (Lot C). Please do not leave your vehicles unattended for any time. If you wish to walk your child into the school buildings, please use Lot C. There is ample room for parking for families of students in grades Kindergarten through eighth. Lot A is for all infant, todders, and prekindergarten classrooms.

When using Lot B, please remember this is a one-way driveway. It is very dangerous to park along Shaker Road when dropping off your children, as many cars coming down the road may not have a clear line of sight. It is also just as convenient to park in Lot C for Kindergarten and first grade, in both the morning and afternoon. Simply follow the sidewalk to the 300 building and avoid the congestion in Lot B.

### **Event Parking**

The maintenance area parking lot is used daily for faculty and staff to allow for ample parking for parents in the morning and afternoon. During large school events, this lot is available for parking rather than parking along Shaker Road or in the active drop-off circles. These areas are to be left open for emergency vehicles.

Please observe the ONE-WAY traffic designs of ALL parking lots on campus. Additionally, be considerate of our neighbors on Shaker Road and on the West Portsmouth Street Athletic Fields, by respecting the posted 30 mph speed limits. We want to do our part to ensure the safety and comfort of those living in the neighborhoods.
